Tenure-track Assistant Professor in Hindi-Urdu at Wake Forest University

Job Description Summary

WAKE FOREST UNIVERSITY's Middle East and South Asia Studies Program is seeking applications for a tenure-track position of Assistant Professor in Hindi-Urdu to start July 1, 2021. As a program, we are a large cohort of faculty across disciplines representing a variety of research and teaching interests pertaining to the Middle East and South Asia. This Hindi-Urdu position marks an expansion into the formal, permanent instruction of South Asian languages.

Job Description:

Wake Forest University invites applications for a tenure-track position as Assistant Professor of Hindi-Urdu beginning July 1, 2021. We seek candidates that strive for the teacher-scholar ideal, pursuing an active research agenda while also committed to excellence in teaching. The candidate who is hired will be expected to teach Hindi-Urdu at all levels and oversee the Hindi-Urdu program; the candidate will also have the flexibility to offer courses in their research specialization. Minimum qualifications include a doctoral degree in Hindi or Urdu language or literature or a related field with facility in both the Devanagari (Hindi) and Nastaliq (Urdu) writing systems. Candidates must also have at least one year of demonstrated success in the teaching of Hindi-Urdu at the college/university level.

Wake Forest University is a private, coeducational institution dedicated to academic excellence in liberal arts, graduate, and professional education. The university has twenty-six affiliated faculty in the Middle East and South Asia Studies Program, including a large cohort specializing in South Asia (see https://mesas.wfu.edu/affiliated-faculty/). The Hindi-Urdu position marks an expansion into the formal, permanent instruction of South Asian languages, and we are looking for candidates with enthusiasm and creativity in developing undergraduate curricula to support the continued growth of South Asian studies.

- Teaching statement including plan to establish an inclusive learning environment;
- Sample undergraduate course syllabi representing language and thematic courses;
- Teaching evaluations or other evidence of effective student engagement;
- Copy of graduate transcript(s) (official copies only required upon employment).

In addition to the above, we ask that candidates have three letters of recommendation either emailed to wakejobs@wfu.edu or mailed directly to the address listed below. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled, but to guarantee full consideration they should be received by November 20, 2020.
